However, we use indirect questions in a different way from reported questions. Indirect questions are a way of being polite. They are very, very common in English, especially when you're talking to someone you don't know. 'Yes / No' Questions To make an indirect 'yes / no' question, we use 'if' and the word order of a normal positive sentence. This is the same as for reported 'yes / no' questions.

Indirect Questions Exercise 2 - Perfect English Grammar

Indirect questions are a way to make questions more polite. For example: What time is it? (normal question) Do you know what time it is? (polite, indirect question) If a question doesn't begin with a word like who or what or how often, we use if instead. For example: Are you married? (normal question) Would you mind telling me if you are married? (polite, indirect question)

Direct question: What do you want? Indirect question: Can you tell me what you want? Direct question: When did she leave? Indirect question: Do you know when she left? In yes/no questions, if or whether is used. The word order is the same as in reported questions. Direct question: Have you seen my dog? Indirect question: Could you tell me if you have seen my dog?

Indirect questions - Test English

An indirect question is not a question at all. In a direct question, the auxiliary verb comes before the subject. However, in an indirect question, the auxiliary verb comes after the subject. What 's more, an indirect question ends with a full stop, not a question mark.
