The clue is in the title (though this title was given to the poem by Wordsworth's executors after his death). The Prelude was written as a prelude or an introduction to The Recluse, the great philosophical poem that Wordsworth, encouraged by Coleridge, dreamed of writing but never completed.

Wordsworth suddenly "foresees" the expulsion of the monastics (in 1792) by the revolutionary republicans and is aghast. He hears the ominous voice of nature cry out in defense of the monastery. Wordsworth himself defends the justice of the Revolution and praises the new liberty (this is his first mention in The Prelude of the Revolution). But like the Revolution, says Wordsworth, allegiance to the monastic vow also levels the difference between aristocrat and peasant.
